-  Mobilize your community



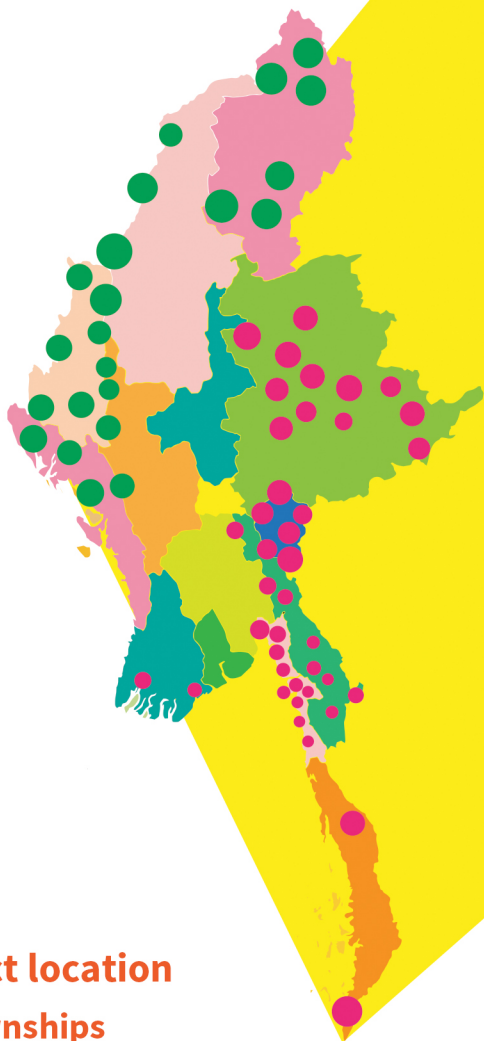
